One of the many "Pearls of Wisdom" my mother taught was save for a "Rainy" day. She told me to save the first dime of each dollar and to keep it to myself. Husbands don't need to know. (LOL). Since that time long ago I have added significant money management tools and knowledge for that Rainy Day savings. Let's look at mortgage payments. Lesson is to add to your monthly mortgage payment to reduce interest balance and loan period.

Loan Balance \$122,877.79 Monthly Payment \$1188.03

Additional Payment \$300.00 monthly (principal ONLY) Breaking down \$300.00 monthly is \$75.00 weekly or \$10.71 daily.

(\$4.65 Starbuck's Tea, \$1.95, Starbuck's Chocolate Chip Cookie, \$5.99 Big Mac = \$12.59 daily)

You have the money, it hurts for the first month, after that with automatic deductions the pain stops. Check with your bank or credit union, my financial institution allows any amount to be transferred from on account to another. Title YOUR new savings account "Divine Feminine".

Based on these calculations you will save \$75,627 in interest over the life of the loan. Your mortgage interest savings will differ based on your mortgage.

Such a strategy allows flexibility and peace of mind. If for example you need extra money for a project in a given month, you may not have to sweat it too much.

No one is about to forget the negative financial consequences inflicted on many by the COVID pandemic. It "pays" to have a little cushion. The first step is really the hardest. The above line of thought is applicable to any type of recurring monthly payment (credit card?), think about paying a little extra. If no standing obligation, think of exercising those "saving" muscles anyway.

As a result of COVID-19 and all of the stress, sadness and uncertainty surrounding this global pandemic, I enrolled in a 10-week training titled Sisters Mentally Mobilized (SMM). SMM is a program created by the California Black Women's Health Project to train Black women in becoming mental health advocates to conduct sister circles for Black women in their respective communities.

This workshop required that I create and present a sister circle mobilization activity that I could conduct in my community. On December 13, 2020 at my graduation from the program, I presented "The Black Doll Project" — a space for Black women to learn, communicate and heal through creating Black dolls. An employee from the Boeing Corporation was present during the graduation ceremony and awarded my cohort a grant to do sister circles surrounding Black dolls in the Inland Empire. Needless to say, I was very grateful that I along with my sisters from the Sisters Mentally Mobilized Inland Empire cohort would be funded to do work surrounding an idea I thought of and love — Black dolls and sister circles for Black women.

In 2017, I produced and presented the First Black Doll Show in the Inland Empire in Claremont, California. At this event, the renowned Black doll artist and creator, Floyd Bell, was present and showcased his wooden dolls. It was an amazing experience to have him present and to see his amazing dolls. He even auctioned off a doll with the proceeds from the auction going to charity. I am grateful that out of that experience, I was led to continue to find a way to introduce my love for Black dolls as a presentation in December for my SMM graduation.

I began collecting Black dolls more than 20 years ago when I would be out shopping and see a very unique, beautiful and often unseen doll. The more beautiful Black dolls I saw, the more I collected. I collected so many until I realized that in 2017, I had collected so many dolls that I wondered what I would do with them. I decided to showcase them to raise money for charity. My San Gabriel Valley Section sisters showed up and supported the First Black Doll show I did in December 2017.

On Sunday, May 23, 2021 and Sunday, May 30, 2021 from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. the Inland Empire Chapter of Sisters Mentally Mobilized will be presenting a virtual sister circle called **The Black Doll Project – Creating Black Dolls for Healing**. Each participant will be mailed a craft kit with everything needed to create their own Black doll. The workshop will be facilitated by Margery Melvin and Ms. Gloria Grandy, a renowned Black doll artist and creator. We will discuss the history of Black dolls, Black female identity and how Black dolls can create a sense of possibility for Black children. Information and a flyer will follow within the next two weeks.

On behalf of the members of the Metro-Jackson Section NCNW, Inc., I say thank you for Your generous gift of \$400.00. Additionally, we thank you for thinking about helping us, your Sisters in Jackson, Mississippi, meet the needs of our community in this time of crisis.

We added funds to your donation and purchased 207 cases of water for distribution to two different locations in one of the hardest hit areas (Ward 3) in the City of Jackson. We collaborated with the Leaders of that Ward, and located a senior center where some residents were disabled, frail, and many had no transportation to reach previous distribution sites.

Not only did we work with the leaders of the area, we partnered with another non-profit organization, "The Better Men Society." That group loaded and distributed the water to the senior center and to an apartment complex, where there were lots of families with children.
